
The Living Income Concept

Living Income is the net annual income required for a household in a particular place to afford a decent standard of living for all members of that household.

Living Income vs Living Wage

The concepts of living wage and living income are both about achieving a decent standard of living for households. While the concept is similar, living wage and living income serve different populations.



- Farmers within a supply chain
- Often used in the context of smallholder farmers who grow a single commodity crop that has dramatic price swings
- Often used in the context of the global majority (Latin America,
 Africa & Asia) where social security nets, access to information and the ability to organize is limited
- Decent standard of living is based on annual income required for a household, as smallholder farmers often only use family labor





- Direct employees or wage workers within a supply chain
- Often used in the context of cities and towns with formal currency
- Wage that provides a decent standard of living for a standard workweek
- Decent standard of living is based on monthly income required for an individual
- Wage workers often have more access to alternative work and the ability to organize for wage changes

A Living Income Supports many other Goals!



Living Income is at the core of realizing numerous SDGs. No Poverty, Decent Work and Economic Growth, Reduced Inequalities and Sustainable Production being some of the most interconnected goals.



Goals on "livelihoods" may include access to clean drinking water, food security, education, women's economic empowerment etc. Living income does not provide access but does provide a level of income required to afford these services and goods.

Food Security & Nutrition

A living income benchmark includes "food for a model diet". Living income does not provide access but does provide a level of income required to afford a locally nutritious diet.

Climate Resiliency, Deforestation & Regenerative Ag


Farmers who earn a living income are better able to invest in their farms: preparing for climate change, making the transition to regenerative agriculture and more likely to protect trees from deforestation.



3. Develop Strategy, Find Data

A living income benchmark is an estimate of the cost of a basic and decent standard of living for a household.



3. Develop Strategy, Find Data

Actual income is the total net household income of a farming family.

Basic Variables of Actual Income Analysis


- Primary Cash Crop
 - Farmgate Price
 - Farm Size
 - Yield
 - Cost of Production
- Net Income from other sources or % of total income from primary cash crop
 - Other Farm Income
 - Off-farm Income
 - Food Produced at Home

Finding Household Income Data

- Farmer self-reported income data
 - Farmer surveys
 - Farm records, passbooks etc.
- Cooperative or aggregator records from primary cash crop
- Research studies of typical incomes in a region
- Impact assessments done in your supply chains, competitor sustainability programme data etc.
- *Note on data accuracy in notes section

3. Develop Strategy, Pilot Strategies

The Gap to a living income can provide many insights into your supply chain. By creating a farm economic model you can start to understand how critical variables might contribute to closing the gap.



4. Implementation

Work with colleagues, sector groups and multi-stakeholder initiative to create a strategy and implement action

You might already implement a number of these strategies with your partners. There are two important aspects to remember:

- **Inclusion first:** Leaving farmers who need to transition out of a strategy is not part of a living income strategy.
- Multifaceted approach: Different farming communities will require a variety of strategies that include all 4 buckets.



Changing Regulatory Landscape



EU Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive (EU CSDDD)

- Directive on Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence
- **Goal:** Define binding human rights and environmental due diligence obligations for companies active on the EU market in all sectors
- Envisaged scope: Companies with 500 or more employees and an annual turnover of at least €150 million on the EU market.

 Companies in risk sectors (agriculture, textiles, mining) with 250 or more employees and an annual turnover of at least €40 million on the EU market.
- **Current Status:** Vote is delayed until at least June and it is likely that the EU may attempt to further reduce sustainability requirements enacted within the past few years. While some version of the CSDDD may exist in the future, expect a significant reduction in corporate liability.

Why Governments use a living income methodology

A Living Income approach examines household incomes and income gaps.

This information helps identify economic development risks and evaluate and target policies and investments.

It provides a basis for collaborative, harmonized, complementary strategies to reduce income gaps.

Increased collaboration and alignment between intergovernmental agencies and ministries

Improved data for strategic planning & continuous improvement metrics
